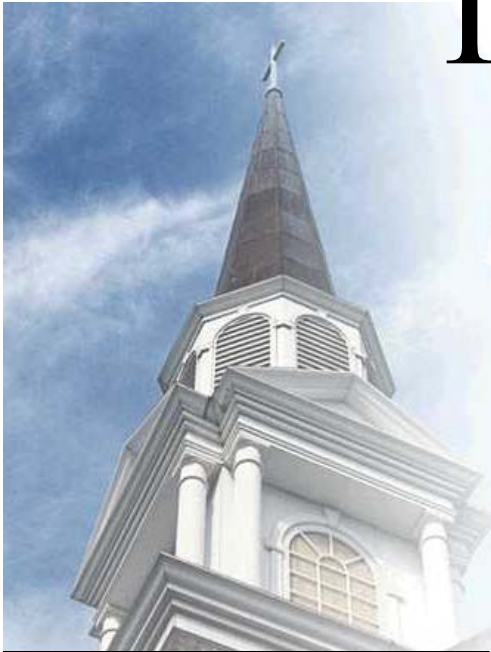

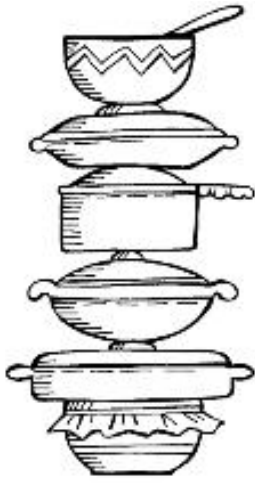

Pentecost

Pentecost Day is the culmination and pinnacle of the Easter-Pentecost Season. The name of the festival is derived from the Jewish harvest festival of Pentecost that was celebrated on the fiftieth day after Passover. In the Christian Church, the season of Easter, "The Great Fifty Days," opens with Easter Day and concludes with Pentecost Day. Pentecost encompasses the death, resurrection, ascension of Jesus, and the giving of the Holy Spirit and all God's gifts for ministry. On this fiftieth day of Easter, we remember and celebrate God's covenant and promises through Jesus Christ.

We celebrate God's gift of the Holy Spirit as God's power among us that transforms, heals, forgives, inspires, and unites.



The dominant color for Pentecost is flame red. Symbols of Pentecost include tongues of flame, a descending dove, and symbols of the Church such as the ship. The season After Pentecost is bracketed by Trinity Sunday and Christ the King Sunday. The reading for Pentecost Day is Acts 2:1-21. Luke portrays the Holy Spirit being poured out upon the disciples before the people assembled in Jerusalem gathered for the festival. It was through the gift of the power of the Holy Spirit that the disciples were then able to witness to the power of the resurrection of Christ.

On this last Sunday of the Easter-Pentecost Season, the Day of Pentecost, the birth of the Church is finally reported. It might seem a bit odd that it is at the end of the season of Easter that we finally get to get this passage in Acts. However, it is a theological ordering instead of a chronological ordering. It is affirmation that the Church is built on the sturdy foundation of the resurrection of Jesus Christ and its proclamation by the people of faith just as it was for those first disciples.

The Day of Pentecost is the Birthday of the Church. It is about the bold, forward-moving, witnessing Church being formed out of a huddled scared band of followers who were hiding behind closed doors. By the Spirit they were united, given courage, and then plunged and driven out into the streets of Jerusalem with hearts afire to proclaim the good news of the gospel of the Risen One so that all could understand. It was only in the power of the Holy Spirit that they moved from paralyzed to proclamation. The same Spirit still moves the community of faith to boldly witness to the world. Pentecost is about the church in community called together by the Holy Spirit. This is to what we are called as individuals and bound together by the Spirit into one Body, the Body of Christ.

Through the same Holy Spirit, who has always been, the Risen Christ is made present and known. The Spirit of God has been and is ever active and is referenced throughout the Old Testament. "Send forth your Spirit and renew the face of the earth." [Psalm 104:30] In Luke's Gospel, the work of the Holy Spirit is evident as early as recorded the very first chapter with the angelic birth announcements of John (the Baptizer) and Jesus in Luke 1:14, 15 and Luke 1:35, 36. The events of the Day of Pentecost, are recorded only by Luke.

In the one Spirit, we are baptized into one body, the Body of Christ, and at the Lord's Table, we are united by the Spirit as witnessed in the world.

Come, Holy Spirit, into your Church and fill us with the power and purpose of your gospel

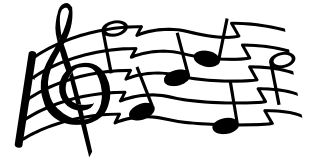

Items needed to jump-start decorating for VBS:

- Cookware: pots, pans, woks, large mixing bowls, tea kettles
- Kitchen tools: wooden spoons, ladles, spatulas, potato mashers, egg beaters, graters, colanders
- Small appliances: blenders, coffee makers, stand mixers, microwaves, toasters or toaster ovens, waffle makers, small appliance boxes
- Miscellaneous kitchen items: dish towels; oven mitts; aprons; place mats; plastic dinnerware (plates, cups, silverware); kitchen canisters or mason jars; domed cake stands; baskets; café-themed, chef-themed, or food-themed wall art; canned or boxed food items; cookbooks
- Furniture: bar stools; patio tables, chairs, and umbrellas; bistro sets; wire, metal, or plastic pantry shelves; children's kitchen sets
- Ingredients for building: large appliance boxes; twin inflatable mattresses with solid colored sheets; colored plastic plates; white rope; styrofoam balls; five-gallon buckets with lids; pastel-colored playground balls; clothesline and clothespins; wire hangers; shipping tubes; two-liter drink bottles; pool noodles; clean, round garbage cans; plastic swimming pool; packing peanuts; inner tubes
- Spice up the scene: red & white or blue & white checkered fabric; plastic tablecloths; plastic "play" foods such as fruits and vegetables; chalkboards; autographed celebrity pictures in frames; harvest decorations such as gourds or ears of corn; party decorations with a Mexican, Italian, Chinese, tiki, or seaside theme; candy cane or gingerbread decorations; white and colored mini lights; balloons

August 28—UMYF Welcome Back Cook Out. Time and place to be announced.

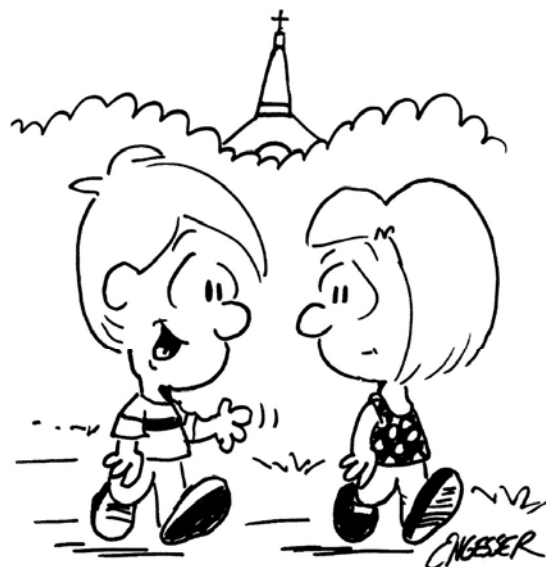
