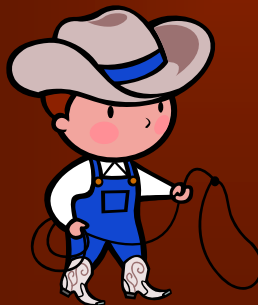

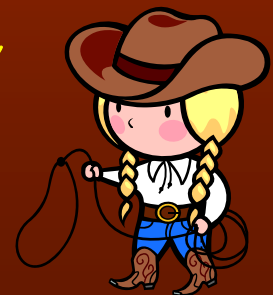

Shalom to you...



Ash Wednesday, March 9th marks the opening of the Lenten season this year. Lent is a season of forty days EXCLUDING Sundays. The word *Lent* comes from the Anglo-Saxon word *lencten*, which means “spring.” Lent begins with a solemn call to repentance as we begin our journey to the refreshing, life-giving waters of baptism at Easter. We will hear the call to “Return to the Lord, your God, who is gracious and merciful, slow to anger, and abounding in steadfast love.” [Joel 2:13]

On Ash Wednesday, we will be given the opportunity to receive the imposition of ashes and Holy Communion. We will reflect on the meaning of our own mortality and our own baptism into Christ’s death and resurrection. The sign of the cross in ashes on our foreheads is a visible reminder of our own human frailty and is an invitation to a new beginning. We are washed in the love of God and God’s mercy and forgiveness. The ashen cross is symbolic of our journey into the spiritual renewal of the springtime Easter feast and promise of eternal life.

On March 17th we also recognize “St. Patrick’s Day” most commonly associated with shamrocks and wearing the color green. St. Patrick became a Christian missionary who is the most commonly recognized patron saint of Ireland. There are two letters that are generally accepted as having been penned by St. Patrick. One is known as the *Confessio* (Latin) and *Epistola* (Latin). The first is the source of what has universally been accepted as containing details of his life and mission.

It is believed that at approximately 16-years-old, Patrick was kidnapped from Britain by Irish pirates and sold into slavery in Ireland. After six years, he escaped and returned to his family in southwest Britain. He had admitted that up to the point of his kidnapping he had given very little thought about God. However, following his experience in captivity and return home, he began preparation for serving in the ordained ministry. It is reported that a voice in a dream advised him to return to Ireland to serve the people whom he had met there. He did later return to Ireland, but this time to serve as a missionary and a bishop. By the seventh century he had become revered as the “patron saint of Ireland.”

St. Patrick’s Day is observed on March 17th, believed to be the date of his death. Legend credits St. Patrick with the use of the shamrock in teaching the concept of the Holy Trinity. By using the three leaf clover, he taught the Christian belief of the Triune God, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. As the shamrock has three distinct leaves, it is still one plant, the Trinity has three Persons in one – “God in three persons, blessed Trinity.” (*Holy, Holy, Holy! Lord God Almighty*, p. 64 UMH)

As we journey through March and Lent toward the renewing baptismal waters of Easter, it seems appropriate and meaningful to reflect on the lyrics to the famous baptismal hymn attributed to St. Patrick, *I Bind Myself Today*, a portion of which follows. The lyrics are set to the tune *St. Patrick’s Breastplate* and were published in 1774.

I Bind Myself Today

I bind unto myself today
The strong name of the Trinity
By invocation of the same,
The Three in One and One in Three. (ELW 450)

Christ with me, Christ before me, Christ behind me, Christ in me,
Christ beneath me, Christ above me, Christ on my right, Christ on my left,
Christ when I lie down, Christ when I sit down, Christ when I arise...
I arise today through a mighty strength, the invocation of the Trinity,
through belief in threeness, through confession of the oneness,
of the Creator of Creation. (from St. Patrick’s Breastplate Prayer)

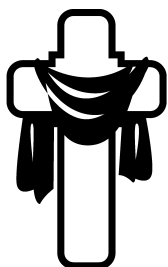

Bake for 8-10 min. at 350 degrees

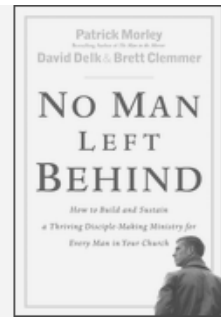

The fear of rejection may be one of the most basic fears of the human experience. Dr. Joe Harding tells a heart-warming story of a man who finally decided to ask his boss for a raise in salary. It was Friday. He told his wife that morning what he was about to do, All day the man felt nervous and apprehensive. Late in the afternoon he summoned the courage to approach his employer. To his delight, the boss agreed to a raise.

The man arrived home to a beautiful table set with their best china. Candles were lighted. His

wife had prepared a festive meal. Immediately he figured that someone from the office had tipped her off! Finding his wife in the kitchen, he told her the good news. They embraced and kissed, then sat down to a wonderful meal. Next to his plate the man found a beautiful lettered note. It read: “Congratulations, darling! I knew you’d get the raise! These things will tell you how much I love you.”

While on his way to the kitchen to get dessert he noticed that a second card had fallen from her pocket. Picking it off the floor, he read: “Don’t worry about not getting the raise! You deserve it anyway!”

These things will tell you how much I love you.”

Total acceptance! Total love. Her love for him was not contingent upon his success at work. In fact, just the opposite. If he were to fail there, if he were to be rejected by his boss, he’d be all the more accepted at home. She stood behind him no matter what; softening the blows, healing the wounds, believing in him, loving him. We can be rejected by almost anyone if we’re loved by one.

That’s the way families can be with each other. And I like to think that’s the way God is with us, too! “We love because he first loved us.”

Confirmation Sunday is **May 15**.

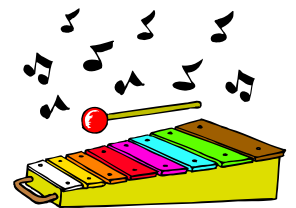

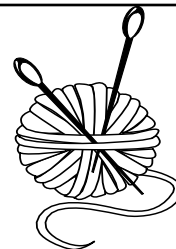
